- Students will prepare research papers that critically analyze real problems and challenges and/or case studies related to the legal environment of business, human resource management, mediation & problems and prepared to the legal environment of business, human resource management, mediation
- Student will also satisfy this competency in the preparation of the report described above in Box A in this Information Competence Section.
- Students will prepare a report describing their investigation into and actual involvement/role in a diverse community's planning or economic development committee or council.
