Transfer Preparation* (Major Code: 01800)

Designed to prepare students for transfer into a liberal studies program at a four-year university. This degree focuses on requirements for SDSU's Liberal Studies program. The required courses in art, child development, communication, composition, education, exercise science, history, literature, mathematics, music, and the sciences offer students a breadth of study across disciplines. In this integrated course of study, students learn to think critically, communicate clearly and effectively, and understand the underlying connections among different subjects.

Foreign Language Requirement

There is no foreign language requirement. However, students interested in earning a bilingual teaching credential will be required to take upper division coursework in the language of the bilingual credential. For example, students who wish to earn a bilingual teaching credential in Spanish will be required to take upper division coursework in Spanish.

San Diego State University

The Southwestern College associate degree requirements for Liberal Studies: Elementary Education are modeled after San Diego State's and will fulfill most of the requirements. Please see a counselor for additional requirements.

All SDSU majors (1991-92 or later catalog) are required to prepare an assessment portfolio that demonstrates their mastery of the subject matter. Because a portfolio should show growth in ability, syllabi and samples (graded papers, exams, and projects) should be saved from all lower-division courses.

All SDSU majors (2003-04 or later catalog) are also required to pass part or all of the California Subject Examination for Teachers-Multiple Subject (CSET-MS), depending upon their career goal. The State of California currently allows students to take lower and upper division coursework in place of the CSET exam. Any student interested in CSET waiver should meet with a counselor to ensure that the appropriate classes are taken to meet CSET waiver requirements.
