### Transfer Preparation\* (Major Code: A1201)

The Gender Studies program focuses on gender experiences and questions of gender from a variety of perspectives including gender theories, humanities, history, religion, literature, multicultural studies, psychology, sociology, and sexuality of gender. This program explores the historical, social, and cultural contributions of all genders within a global perspective while providing knowledge about sexual forms of oppression. The study of gender is the study of humanity.

## Program Student Learning Outcomes

- By the end of the program the student will analyze literature and cultural artifacts and write and evaluate papers on topics such as point of view and themes of exile, abuse, oppression, and gender specific messages.
- By the end of the program the students will participate in volunteer service in the community related to Gender Studies.
